Hunter Tunnell Completes Eagle Scout Project Benefitting Kentuck Art Center

[NORTHPORT, ALABAMA]—Hunter Tunnell, a Life Scout Troop 90 member and 17 year old student at Tuscaloosa County High School, has successfully completed his Eagle Scout Project, which involved building 6 Leopold benches for Kentuck Art Center's Courtyard of Wonders.

Tunnell spent eight months planning the project, beginning with ideation and building a project proposal with the help of his coach, to financing the project himself and working with 8 fellow Scouts and 4 adult volunteers to build the benches onsite at Kentuck Art Center on March 4, 2023.

The Leopold benches are a great addition to Kentuck Art Center, providing a comfortable and inviting place for visitors to enjoy the whimsical outdoor sculptures and Kentuck's events in the Courtyard of Wonders.


The Leopold bench design was originally created by Aldo Leopold, an environmentalist and avid birdwatcher, and considered by many to be the father of wildlife ecology. This bench design is favored by birdwatchers because it allows people to sit both forwards and backwards. Sitting backwards on the bench allows birdwatchers to steady their elbows while looking through binoculars, or excited art patrons to view the Courtyard of Wonders from multiple angles. Tunnell and his team worked to ensure that each bench was of the highest quality and met all safety standards.

"Kentuck Art Center is thrilled to have new places for arts patrons to sit when they visit Kentuck's Courtyard of Wonders," said Amy Echols, Executive Director at Kentuck Art Center. "Hunter and his team did a wonderful job organizing this project and building these benches. Thousands of courtyard visitors will benefit from Hunter's work for years to come.
